FCIC's Programs & Selected Projects

— National —



Early Childhood Technical Assistance Center (ECTA)

FCIC has a subcontract with the Early Childhood Technical Assistance Center. ECTA is a national center funded by the US Department of Education (ED) Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) to support early intervention and preschool special education programs and practitioners.



National Center for Pyramid Model Innovations (NCPMI)

NCPMI is funded by the Office of Special Education Programs to improve and support the capacity of state systems and local programs to implement an early childhood multi-tiered system of support to improve the social, emotional, and behavioral outcomes of young children with, and at risk for, developmental disabilities or delays.



National Technical Assistance Center for Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (Center on PBIS)

This national center is funded by both the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education (OESE) and the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services (OSERS) to enhance knowledge about the multi-tiered PBIS framework, and develop, conduct and evaluate technical assistance and dissemination efforts for whole school success.

Center for Autism and Related Disabilities (CARD)

CARD is funded by the Florida Department of Education (FDOE), Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services (BEES), and provides support and assistance with the goal of optimizing the potential of people with autism and related disabilities.



Florida's Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support: Multi-Tiered System of Support (FLPBIS:MTSS) Project

Funded by the FDOE, BEES, the FLPBIS: MTSS provides training and technical assistance to increase the capacity of Florida school districts to implement evidence-based practices for supporting students with and without disabilities who are exhibiting problem behaviors.



Florida Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters Training and Technical Assistance Center (Florida HIPPY T&TAC)

Funded by State of Florida, the Florida HIPPY Training and Technical Assistance Center provides support and training to local HIPPY programs in Florida. HIPPY provides a home-based, early intervention/school readiness program that helps educationally disadvantaged parents provide educational enrichment for their preschool children aged 2-5.



Interdisciplinary Center for Evaluation and Intervention (ICEI)

ICEI is funded by the FDOE and is one of their Florida Diagnostic and Learning Resources System (FDLRS) diagnostic and training centers. ICEI specializes in preschool and school-aged students (ages 3-22) having autism spectrum disorders, serious behavioral/social/emotional challenges, and other complex conditions.



Delivering Innovative Vocational Education Through Virtual Reality Technology (DIVE-VRT)

DIVE-VRT is designed to train individuals with disabilities in skilled trades, providing them with the industry knowledge and employment soft skills necessary for future success.



LAUNCH at USF

LAUNCH at USF is a structured employment-focused curriculum for individuals diagnosed with Autism. LAUNCH Employment Services assists individuals in preparing for, securing, maintaining, or retaining employment, and to assure satisfaction of the employer and individual.



Program-Wide Positive Behavior Support (PBS) Project

PWPBS is funded by the Children's Board of Hillsborough County to support the program-wide adoption of the Pyramid Model for supporting the development of young children's social competence and addressing challenging behavior.



Florida AWARE

Florida AWARE is funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and FDOE BEES and is committed to assisting districts in developing safer schools, improving school climate, increasing awareness of mental health issues, and developing a continuum of social, emotional, and behavioral supports that ensures improved outcomes for all students.



Florida Connect

This model demonstration project, funded by the ED OSEP, works with three high implementing PBIS middle schools in Marion County to integrate the Interconnected Systems Framework (ISF) and coordinate effective and efficient service delivery to students at risk and with disabilities.
